Eleanor Everywhere

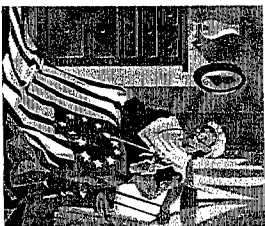
By Monica Kulling

By Alexandra Wallner

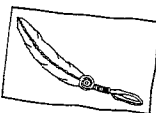
An introduction to the life of the Philadelphia seamstress credited with sewing the first American flag. Ages 7-9.

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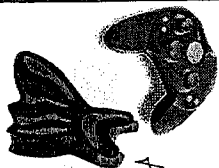
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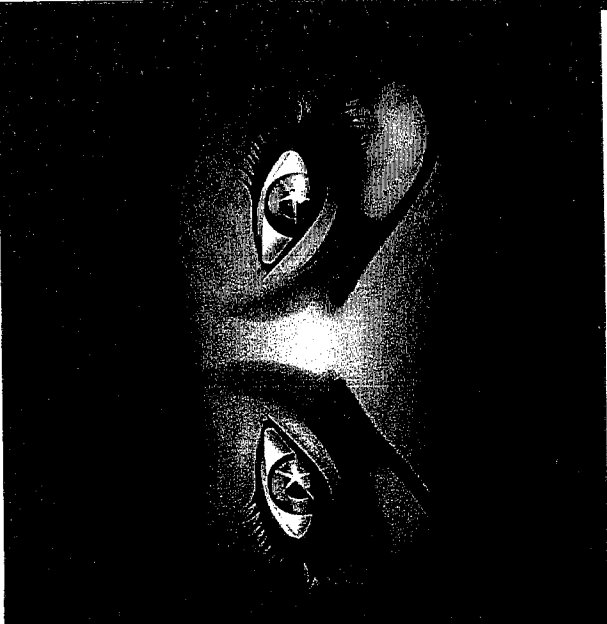

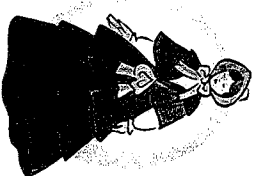

Miley Cyrus

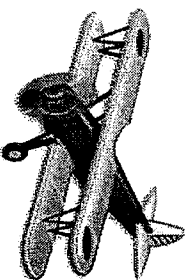
By Katie Franks
