This photo-filled chapter book provides a basic introduction to the process of voting. A glossary, index, and suggested internet sites to discover more, are Included.

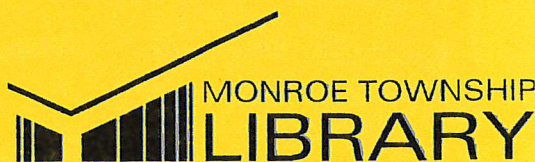
A Woman for President: the Story of Victoria Woodhull
