A grumpy yet loveable man finds his solitary world turned on its head when a boisterous young family moves in next door.

The Angel Makers (Fiction) by Gregson, Jessica

Enjoying freedom with neighbor women in her village when their abusive men go off to war, medicine woman Sari uses her skills to kill her returned husband and is quickly sought by her new friends for the same service, with dire results.

On the Bright Side (Fiction) by **Groen, Hendrik**

Everyone's favorite curmudgeon is back and as funny and charming as ever with the newest adventures of the Old-But-Not-Dead Club--for fans of Frederik Backman and Graeme Simsion.

Water For Elephants (Fiction) by Gruen, Sara

Ninety-something-year-old Jacob Jankowski remembers his time in the circus as a young man during the Great Depression, and his friendship with Marlena, the star of the equestrian act, and Rosie, the elephant, who gave them hope.

Dead Until Dark (Fiction) by Harris, Charlaine

Love blossoms between Sookie Stackhouse, a cocktail waitress in rural Louisiana who keeps to herself because of her ability to read minds, and Bill, a tall, dark, and handsome vampire with ties to a creepy crowd that may be responsible for the death of one of Sookie's coworkers.
